CHOOSE THIS LIVEABOARD FOR LOTS OF SPACE AND LUXURY WHILE DIVING THE MOST REMOTE SITES IN THE INDO-PACIFIC



Find tranquility, luxury and comfort aboard the *Pelagian*, which accesses the region's best diving.

This 115-foot liveaboard redefines luxury, catering to a maximum of 10 divers or snorkelers, with more space per guest than any other dive yacht of its kind. Operating out of the world-renowned private-island Wakatobi Dive Resort, just south of Sulawesi, this upscale dive resort focuses on the seldom-visited corners of the Tukang Besi

archipelago, known for walls, muck diving and endless critters.

Onboard, the *Pelagian* is like no other liveaboard you've been on. Everything is designed with a Zen-like flow, with high-end comfort rivaling any hotel. Take the master suite. It has a true king-size bed. The super-lux category of cabins feature queen beds, with nightstands and room to walk on each side of the bed. There are no bunk beds. All rooms feature light, airy modern décor, much like a spa.

The meals will also change how you view dive travel.
An onboard chef prepares à la carte menus, ranging from tuna sashimi to local shrimp curries.

The vessel also features a separate interior room functioning as a dedicated camera workshop,

allowing guests to spread out, recharge and work on their equipment.

As for the diving, *Pelagian* travels to the most remote stretches of Southeast Sulawesi. You will rarely see another dive vessel

throughout the duration of your voyage.

A signature dive is Magic Pier, where divers will witness hundreds of mandarinfish performing mating dances, as well as blue-ringed octopus.

During most cruises, guests may also lay eyes on three pygmy seahorse species: Bargibanti, Denise, Pontohi and Severns.

Itineraries also include wall dives, like Escape, found off the island of Buton. It's a favorite among repeat guests for the 12-foot high cavernlike structure, curtained by black corals and red whip corals, surrounded by scores of macro finds, from nudibranchs to mantis shrimp.
